Operating Levy Information

Here is more information on the operating levy. Some of this is a repeat from last week's article and some of it is new. Here are some key points:

- The District has determined to request \$790 per pupil increase from our constituents. This increase is based on students enrolled at Cedar Mountain.
- Homes are taxed on property value.
- Agricultural property is taxed on home, garage and one acre of land only.
- The last operating levy increase at Cedar Mountain was in 2001.
- If approved, the increase in funding would not take place until the 2019-2020 school year.
- The average home in the Cedar Mountain School District is valued at about \$76,000. At this valuation, taxes will increase \$15 a month or \$175 a year.
- Homestead Credit Rebates are available to qualifying property owners.
- The district made approximately \$200,000 in reductions for the 2018-19 school year.
- Cedar Mountain is seeking an Operating Levy, not a building bond.
- The increase funding will be utilized to make up for the decrease seen in state aid.
