This year is an election year. In addition to the governor's race, we have many state and local elections taking place. At Cedar Mountain, we will be filling 3 open positions. The candidates who have filed for the 3 Cedar Mountain School Board positions are Ash Heibel, Jennifer Rose, and Doug Mathiowetz.

In addition to school board openings, Cedar Mountain is proposing to increase their operating levy by \$790 per student. The district is currently receiving \$724 in operating levy revenue, one of the lowest amounts in the state. Increased costs due to insurance, salaries, and inflation have resulted in the district costs exceeding revenues. In addition, how the State funds schools has negatively affected Cedar Mountain. An operating levy allows districts to receive state aid for part of the approved amount, and ag land is only taxed on a house, garage, and one acre of land.
