

Cedar Mountain Student Community Service

When I think about “Cedar Mountain Pride,” I always look at the many ways our students are involved in community service. I would like to comment on a few of these projects. The first was Socktober, an event organized by the Cedar Mountain Blue Crue to raise awareness of homelessness. Throughout the month of October, students were asked to bring new socks to school. They partnered with community education's Piyo class to gather the socks for Redwood County Human Services to be used for those in need. The Socktober sock drive collected over 400 pairs of socks.

Another community service project was the Cedar Mountain Blood Drive. This was held on November 21st. In addition to our students organizing and running this event, 24 Cedar Mountain students were blood donors that day. Thank you to everyone who donated.

Cedar Mountain has done the Adopt An Angel program for many years. The goal this year was to have students and staff adopt 100 angels. The program is simple - middle/high school students and staff may pick an angel for a boy or girl ages 1-13 years old, purchase a gift for them, wrap it, tape the angel to the gift, and return it to school. I am proud to say all 100 angels were adopted.

Our Yellow Ribbon group sponsored a food drive, which ended December 3. Students collected non-perishable food items that will benefit “We Care,” which is located in Morgan and serves families in the surrounding communities.

The elementary student council, call Blue Crue Tue, also sponsored the food drive at the elementary school. Their food drive also ended December 3 and was donated to “We Care.”

This coming Saturday, December 8, from 9:00-11:00, the Cedar Mountain National Honor Society is sponsored Santa Day in the high school cafeteria. Students were able to visit Santa and students in grade 3 and younger received a gift from Santa.

I am proud of our students and their contributions to our communities. We have great students who are doing great things at Cedar Mountain.
