decisions as a district. My first concern is and will always be the safety of our students.

As we move into the second semester of school, we are starting to plan for the 24-25 school year. The school board approved adjusting the credits needed to graduate from 28-24. This will alleviate the need for students to take classes that they are not interested in and allow more elective opportunities for our MSHS students. We are going to be adding an additional AG teacher next school year and also reworking the schedule to incorporate classes that will use more technology. Stay tuned because registration for next school year will be starting soon. At the elementary level we are continuing to follow the updates and requirements that are included in the READ act. We will be introducing a new benchmarking system as well as training staff in LTRS. This training is based on the science of reading.

Kindergarten Connection night is right around the corner. This will take place on March 14th from 5:30-7:00 at Cedar Mountain Elementary - Franklin. We are increasing our offerings for 4 year old students to enroll in either a 2 full day or a 3 full day program and our 3 year olds will be able to enroll in a 3 half days class per week. We are finalizing details and a postcard will be mailed out very soon with additional details and information will also be shared via social media.

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
# ELEMENTARY SPRING CONCERTS

Counselor's

#### Establish a growth mindset

Choose challenging courses for your child. Enroll your child in at least one class that offers college credit such as Advanced Placement, International Baccalaureate, College in the Schools, Project Lead the Way.

#### Avoid the senior slump

Encourage your child to finish strong.
