6th Graders Explore Social Studies!

It has been a busy year for the 6th graders! This year has been filled with field trips, projects, and activities. In Minnesota History, the students have been enriched with many different hands-on approaches to learning. In October, the students learned about the Fur Trade and were able to re-enact it! With furs from the Nicollet Wild Life Association and artifacts from the Traverse des Sioux Treaty site,



the 6th graders were able to become actual fur traders. This was a very energetic and exciting project that even included some 7th grade volunteers! Later on in the year, we took a field trip to the Traverse des Sioux to learn about the Treaty of 1851 and interact with many

Elementary News from Mrs. Machart



Ask any elementary student if they have earned a "pride paw" or if they have gotten a "pride postcard" in the mail - and the answer hopefully will be "YES!" Part of our improved school-wide behavior program is to catch and reward students for following the behavior expectations of our school. The expectations are simple:



BE RESPECTFUL . BE RESPONSIBLE BE PRODUCTIVE . BE SAFE

When students receive a pride paw, it is put in a container in their classrooms. On Fridays, the teacher draws 1 student name who gets to select from a list of prizes such as: chose a friend and eat with the teacher, use the teacher's chair for a day, extra computer time and free home-

work pass. All of the pride paws are collected in a large container and at the end of the quarter 5 names are selected for a Grand Prize or Grand Opportunity!! We are looking forward to the second quarter celebration coming up at the end of January. Cougar Pride Postcards are sent home to students who have gone "above and beyond the call of duty" in following the school expectations for the week. Their group picture is hung on our "Wall of Fame" and is printed in the Morgan Messenger. Another key part of our behavior program is to teach the expectations to the children for each area in the school - similar to how we teach the core subjects. We don't assume that students know how we want them to act in the cafeteria, on the bus, or in other areas. We take the time and teach it to them. For example, this fall each classroom sat on the bus while Damian and Mrs. Machart reviewed the bus rules and then conducted a safety drill. When you visit our school you will notice the Hallway Expectations, Bathroom Expectations, Bus Expectations, etc. are posted. We have noticed good changes in our student's behavior which results in more time being spent on classroom instruction. Be sure to congratulate and recognize your children when they receive a pride paw or postcard! They are all working hard to make our school a positive place to learn!



Minnesota Reading Corps

What exactly is the Minnesota Reading Corps and what is it doing in our school? To put it simply, the Reading Corps is like the Peace Corps for education. Their mission is to have all students at their reading level by third grade. How is this going to happen? By taking students who are right below their reading level, and meeting with them one-onone for twenty minutes a day, every day completing reading interventions. The Reading Corps tutor at Cedar Mountain is Jessica Scheuerlein. She meets with 15 students a day, every day for the entire school year. Each student completes different interventions based on his or her specific needs. These interventions are choosen by the tutor and her coach, which in Cedar Mountain is Angela Sandgren. Jessica has met with 24 students so far this year and has successfully graduated 9 students from grades 1-3 out of the program. She is very excited to start also working with Kindergarten students during the third and fourth quarters and help every child improve their reading ability and develop a love for reading!

2013-14 Planning

Although we are only a little over halfway through this school year, planning for the 2013-14 school year is underway. We hope to have all high school students registered by the beginning of March. The school board, administration, and staff are committed to providing the best education possible from preschool through grade 12. The planning process starts early and con-

tinues through the summer. We are working especially hard to continue providing high school students opportunities to take both college and vocational classes while at Cedar Mountain. When we finish planning for the 2013-14 school year, we want the best possible educational program for all our students. We continue to believe that the difference between ordinary and extraordinary is that little extra.

Health and Safety

Cedar Mountain Schools is constantly evaluating possible threats to the health and safety of students, staff, and the community. We are conscious of the obvious health and safety concerns, such as bleacher safety and playground safety, and those that are not obvious, such as indoor air quality and radon gas. As a school, we publish specific program information as required annually in our September newsletter. We also contract with Advanced Health, Safety and Security to ensure that we are in compliance with state and federal statutes. Staff members are trained in a variety of areas. All staff was offered CPR and first aid training, and they took part in blood borne pathogen training in the fall. Our staff also takes part in specific training programs. For instance, Roger Voelz has been trained in monitoring indoor air quality. Jessica Rehak has completed machine guarding training. Jamie Berner and Kristin Erdmann have been through chemical hygiene training and developed our district's Chemical Hygiene Plan.






UN FRIDAYS Preschool program
