Winter Weather Information

No matter how much I hope we don't, I think that we are going to have severe weather this winter. Based on the assumption that cold temperatures, high winds and heavy snow will come eventually this school year, I want to assure everyone that Cedar Mountain Schools are ready to respond, as needed, when severe weather occurs.

When the weather turns bad, we consider several factors to determine whether to keep schools open, delay school openings, close schools for a day or close schools early. Road conditions are checked, and the temperature and wind chill is monitored closely. I also check weather radar and listen closely to forecasts for our area. If a decision is made to cancel school or adjust the school schedule, I begin to call radio and television stations with that information. Please do not call the radio or television stations, as this tie up their phone lines. Some weather conditions, such as fog, are harder to react to, and the District respects parental decisions if you would choose to keep your child home until the conditions improve.

We live in Minnesota, which is famous for extremes in weather. I believe that we need to have school on days when the weather is not always ideal. If a parent or guardian feels it is unsafe to send their child to school, the school will respect that decision. You need to do what you feel is best for your child.

Listed below are the general procedures we follow at Cedar Mountain:

PROCEDURES FOR INCLEMENT WEATHER

1. All school closings, delayed starting times, and early dismissals will be announced on KLGR- AM 1490, FM 97.7; KNUJ-AM 860; WCCO-AM 830, WCCO-4 TV; KARE-11 TV and KSTP-5 TV. They are also communicated through the Instant Alert system and on the district website at: <http://www.cms.mntm.org/>. Parents and pupils are urged to listen to one of these stations daily, but especially when the weather

is inclement. Normally these stations will be notified of the closing of schools as soon after 6 a.m. as possible. Hearing no announcement, parents and students should assume that the schools will be in session.

2. There are also times when schools are closed earlier than the regular time. If an adult will not be at home, arrangements should be made so that young children have an appropriate place to go. Please make sure that all Snow Emergency Forms have been completed and returned to the principal's office at your child's school.

3. All school activities will not be held when school is closed due to inclement weather.

4. All after-school activities will be canceled when school is dismissed early because of inclement weather.

5. In case of a late start, breakfast will not be served that day.

Winter Busing Procedure

Winters can be very difficult due to snow, wind, and generally crummy weather. In the past, special procedures were put in place regarding bus transportation. I want to review these procedures, as we will follow them again this year.

We have always looked at transportation in terms of safety and we won't take buses on roads that have not been plowed. We will again be following a very strict "plowed roads only" policy for this school year. If you live on a rural road, I ask that you think about an alternate pick up or drop off point for your child in the event we are not able to travel on your road. An example of an alternate pick up or drop off point would be the nearest current stop on a plowed road. If you have questions, I encourage you to contact Cedar Mountain Bus Service at 249-3136. They can work with you to find an appropriate alternate stop. We cannot risk a bus becoming stuck on an unplowed road.

Our goal is to get students to school each day safely. We hope that the weather and road conditions are not a problem this year. But I believe it is best for everyone if we "prepare for the worst and hope for the best".

- Our Kindergarten Jump Start students are excited to be attending all day on Fridays. It is amazing all the routines they are learning. Walking

Students can practice their math facts and chart their progress on a math app. The program even keeps track of which facts they are repeatedly getting wrong. Some classrooms are using an app called See Saw to communicate with parents and send examples of their work! Be sure you are not missing out on this fun if your child's teacher is using it!

- Don't worry --- we still believe in books at Cedar Mountain! The library is some of our kid's favorite place – and we encourage our kids to READ – READ – READ! Prizes are given out monthly to those students that read and pass a quiz to prove their comprehension. Be sure you are modeling the importance of reading at home and are making time to read with your children no matter what age they are!

- We are keeping our eye on attendance as we know being in school regularly is so important to school success! As of today – 75% of our students have had perfect attendance! Absenteeism in the first month of school can predict poor attendance throughout the school year. Half the students who miss 2--4 days in September go on to miss nearly a month of school. We appreciate your help in getting your children to school daily!

Cedar Mountain 8th grade students went on a canoe trip the end of September. Students spent the day floating down the Minnesota River. This is the 2nd year that Cedar Mountain has offered this wonderful learning opportunity for our students.



Thirty Cedar Mountain sophomores attended the Career Expo at Southwest State University in Marshall on Tuesday, October 3. Students learned about a variety of careers available to them in southwest Minnesota and the education necessary to be qualified.



School Attendance

The new federal education law (Every Student Succeeds Act, or ESSA) requires states to use five measures of student success. The first four are related to academics — like annual tests and graduation rates. The fifth is up to the state and is aimed at measuring “student success or school quality.” Minnesota picked consistent attendance for the fifth measure of school quality and student engagement.

For schools, consistent attendance defined as 90% attendance. This means if you are gone 10% of the time, you are considered “chronically absent.” This includes excused and unexcused absences. While attendance is a non-academic measure, it’s very much tied to academics and achievement. In addition to attendance being a primary cause of low academic achievement, it is also a powerful predictor of those students who may eventually drop out of school.

Research shows that kids who are chronically absent in Kindergarten don’t perform as well as their peers in first grade, based on Education Week research. Some of the factors that contribute to chronic absenteeism include students’ leading

troubled lives and/or living in poverty and avoiding class because of reading deficiencies. Another reason was parents allowing their kids to miss school for vacations or “mental health” days.

Attendance in the workplace is also important. For students, school is their workplace. It is important that parents, teachers, and administrators work together so student attendance becomes a high priority. Student with poor attendance habits can become an unemployable adult if he or she keeps those same habits.

As a school, we work very hard to connect with students and for students to have connections to our staff and other students. When students are absent, this does not happen. It is important in our schools that everyone, both adults and students, is here every day. As I say every year, we need to find reasons to be here, not excuses to be gone.

I believe strongly that education is the great equalizer. A quality education is the most consistent tool that allows people to advance their socio-economic status. I also believe that education is something that can’t be taken from you. As educators, it is our privilege and responsibility to provide ALL students with the best education possible. Thank you for all you do as parents and guardians. Like you, we want what is best for your children.





Talk to your kids about technology. Ask them questions about what game they are playing or what app they are using. This will create a trust relationship in which they will feel comfortable sharing issues with you when they arise.

Set specific windows of time when technology is allowed at home. Too much screen time has been linked to poor sleep, a shorter attention span, and decreased physical activity.

Make your kids earn their time online. Change the passwords for your wifi or devices. Make a list of chores that will earn them the password, such as make your bed, do your homework, brush your teeth...

Set tech free zones (or times) in the house. For example, no gadgets allowed in the dining room. Or, no technology after 7pm. (This is good for adults too. And great for sleep hygiene.)

Days & Time: Fridays from 8:20 AM – 3:20 PM


Cost: \$20 per session – billed the month prior to services


