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Cedar Mountain's Program Plan for Distance Learning Governor's Executive Order 20-02

The following plan is subject to revision for measuring attendance and adaptation for lack of internet and other unforeseen circumstances with state law.

Purpose:

• Ensure that every student in the state of Minnesota receives an equitable education and has equal access to learning and instruction during the COVID-19 pandemic.

• If directed by the Governor of Minnesota, Distance Learning will begin on Monday, March 30th. Students are not required to complete any tasks during the two week shut down that was March 16-March 27.

Distance Learning

Distance Learning defined:

Students engaging in distance learning have access to appropriate educational materials and receive daily interaction with their licensed teacher(s).

Content delivery:

PreSchool/ECSE: Students will engage in lessons as outlined in their distance learning packets sent home by teachers. Teachers will communicate with families via See-Saw.

Elementary: Students will engage in lessons as outlined on their distance learning packets sent home by teachers. Teachers will communicate with families daily via See-Saw.

Special Education: Students in pull-out classes will complete distance learning tasks specific to their IEP. Students that receive remedial instruction will receive packets of activities specific to their IEP goals. Teachers will communicate with families daily.

Middle School/High School: Students will utilize Schoology, Google Docs and Apps to complete distance learning tasks. Students will submit evidence of completing distance learning tasks. Directions and tasks will be given for students who do not have internet access at home.

Attendance:

All Families: Please contact the school office if your child is ill and unable to complete assigned daily distance learning call 507-249-5880.

Elementary: Students will be sending photos of their completed work to staff via See-Saw. Packets will also be returned to school depending on the length of closure. Staff can also determine attendance based on usage and work completed in their digital assignments.

Middle school/High school

All students are required to check-in daily for attendance. An exit ticket is a student's attendance for the class. It will be found at the end of each lesson. If a student does not fill out a ticket, their parents will be contacted.

Distribution of Materials for Distance Learning:

 Distribution of Distance Learning materials will begin on Wednesday, March 25th through Thursday, March 26th.

- We ask that only one person from each family picks up materials and that we keep social distancing in mind during pick up.
- Materials will be located in the building where the student attends school.

• Thursday, March 26th: 8:00am-6:00pm

Elementary in Franklin:

- Pick up will be at the main entrance to the school
- A staff member will deliver your family's materials to you.

Middle/High School in Morgan:

- Pick up will be at the Cafeteria entrance
- If you need things from your locker, please call ahead so we can have that ready for you.
- Check Schoology for messages from teachers regarding materials.

Delivery/Special Arrangements:

- If you need materials delivered or a different pick-up time, please contact the school office.
- Delivery for those needing it would take place on Friday, March 27th

Care for Children of families of Emergency Workers:

- Emergency Child Care began on March 17 for children in K-12 years old at no cost to families who meet the criteria of emergency worker. We are utilizing our current Camp Cougar (School Aged Child Care) facility, format and staff. Additional staff and rooms will be added if numbers are 10 or more.
- Children are provided breakfast, lunch and a snack. Activities are a combination of play, outdoor activities, arts and crafts, STEAM activities, etc. We will help children with Distance Learning if the need arises.

Nutrition

Meals and distribution:

The free meal program is offered to anyone 18 and under starting on March 18th. The meals are available to anyone who lives in a community regardless of what school they attend. Non-Cedar Mountain students who live in our communities are more than welcome to stop by school and

receive a free meal. Cedar Mountain students who live in surrounding communities can pick up lunches from the school located in the community where they live.
