





Cedar Mountain CACR Goal:

Introduce new preschool curriculum.

Preschool has used 1-2-3 Learn Curriculum for 11 years. New curriculum has not been purchased in accordance with this goal.

Preschool has been using DRDP (Desired Results Developmental Profile-California's system) for assessments.

Minnesota does not specify curriculums or particular assessments that must be used, but there are new <u>early childhood indicators of progress</u> which must be fully implemented by the fall of 2028.
